Lend Me A Tenor revolves around renowned tenor Tito Merelli, known to his fans as "Il Stupendo", who is scheduled to sing the lead in Otello at a gala fundraiser for the Cleveland Opera Company in 1934. Unfortunately even before the star leaves his hotel room everything begins to unravel. Through a riotous set of mishaps, Tito is given a double dose of tranquilizers, mixed with the booze he has consumed leaves him passed out enough that the opera manager and his assistant Max believe Tito is dead. Max, also an aspiring singer, agrees to try to fool the audience into thinking he is Tito and perform in his stead. All is well until Tito wakes up and heads for the stage. Now two Otellos are running around in costume and two women are running around in lingerie, each thinking she is with Il Stupendo! What ensues is a chain-reaction of mistaken identity; plot twists, double entendres and the constant slamming of many doors.
